OUR MISSION

Driven by the belief that every baby deserves the chance to thrive, we support family and community health by providing equitable access to safe, lifesaving, pasteurized donor human milk.

FULFILLING OUR MISSION

Mothers' Milk Bank Northeast is one of the largest accredited nonprofit milk banks in the country.

In 2024 we:

- Served 116 Hospital Units and Outpatient Dispensaries across 11 states
- Fed approximately 17,000 babies
- Delivered 178.933 bottles of screened and pasteurized donor milk
- Provided approximately 1.5M feedings
- Worked with 1,291 generous milk donors

PREEMIES NEED DONOR MILK!


Babies born at a very low birth weight require human milk to protect them against serious, sometimes fatal medical conditions. Most neonatal intensive care units use donor milk when a mother's own milk is not available. This vital medical resource is known to be safe and highly beneficial.

A BRIDGE TO BREASTFEEDING

Donor milk is increasingly used as a "bridge to breastfeeding." When used as a supplement instead of formula, donor milk can lead to better breastfeeding outcomes. This results in significant health benefits for both mothers and babies. Moreover, it is estimated that every \$1 invested in donor milk yields up to \$37 in future healthcare savings.

WE ARE PUBLIC HEALTH. WE ARE PREVENTION.

Donor milk is prioritized for hospitalized premature and medically fragile babies. It protects against serious medical conditions, especially necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC), a complex intestinal condition.

Every year in the US, thousands of babies develop NEC and premature babies are most at risk. Studies show that NEC is the leading cause of death among preterm babies between two weeks and two months of age.

> NEC IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH AMONG PRETERM BABIES AGED TWO WEEKS TO TWO MONTHS.

Survivors of NEC experience short and long-term complications including liver failure, poor growth, and neurodevelopmental impairment.

Research indicates that an exclusive human milk diet reduces the occurrence of NEC by 50 - 75%. Roughly 90% of NICUs nationwide use human donor milk as the standard of care for very preterm babies, if a mother's own milk is not available.

BRIDGING THE CARE GAP

Every baby deserves a healthy start in life. At Mothers' Milk Bank Northeast, we strive to ensure that every baby who needs donor milk has access to it. Our goal is to provide life-changing nourishment and support to those who need it most.

This year we invested in several initiatives to improve equitable access:

- We translated key materials into seven sought-after languages, including Brazilian Portuguese, Cape Verdean Creole, French, Haitian Creole, Spanish, and Vietnamese, to expand access to donor milk.
- Introduced a professional medical interpreting service enabling us to screen prospective milk donors and recipients in their native language.
- Grew our maternal and infant equity partnerships across Massachusetts with funding from Attorney General Campbell's office.

WE ARE COMMITTED TO DEVELOPING PATHWAYS

Last summer, we partnered with Project Onramp, a program of Life Sciences Cares, to offer two college internships. This program is designed to create specific pathways for less-resourced and often first-generation students, reducing opportunity gaps and promoting a well-prepared, diverse workforce.

THE NONPROFIT DIFFERENCE

We focus on mission, not profits.

We triage our milk to the most medically fragile babies. Milk donors are never recruited or compensated for their gift of milk. This ensures that mom's own baby receives all the nutrition they need first. Keeping financial incentives out of the equation also minimizes other risks to the process. Both the milk donors and the staff are here for the same reason, to help babies who need donor milk receive it safely, so they can grow and thrive.
